

#### **Objective:**

The primary goal of this three-day programme was to empower rural women from Tharuvaikulam, Thoothukudi, by imparting entrepreneurial and skill-development training. The initiative focused on equipping participants with practical knowledge and skills in creative and marketable crafts, thereby fostering self-employment opportunities. Students from the B.A. English Literature major took on the role of trainers, ensuring knowledge transfer in a supportive and interactive manner.

#### **Day 1: South Indian Bridal Makeup Artistry**

The first day commenced with a workshop on **South Indian Bridal Makeup Artistry**, tailored to teach participants both basic and advanced techniques. The session included:

- An introduction to essential tools and products for bridal makeup.
- Step-by-step guidance on achieving traditional South Indian bridal looks.
- Techniques for skin preparation, foundation application, and creating intricate eye makeup styles.
