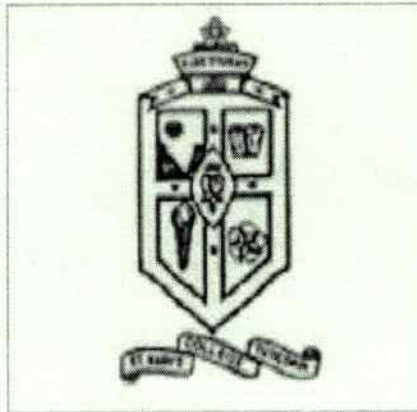

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This MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING (hereinafter referred to as 'MoU') is made on 9th December 2019 at Thoothukudi, Tamil Nadu and executed between:

1. School of Management & Economics (SME), St. Mary's College (Autonomous), Thoothukudi, Tamil Nadu (hereinafter referred to as SME-SMC) is having its institution at School of Management & Economics (SME), St. Mary's College (Autonomous), ECR Road (SH-49), Cruz Puram, Thoothukudi – 628 001, Tamil Nadu (hereinafter referred to as Party I)
2. National Foundation for Entrepreneurship Development (hereinafter referred to as NFED) is having its Registered Office at #5, 2B Vishal Homes, Second Street, S.R.P. Ponnuswamy Nagar, Saibaba Colony, Coimbatore – 641 011, Tamil Nadu (hereinafter referred to as Party II).

SCOPE OF THIS MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

THE PARTIES INTEND TO:

- (a) Work together to establish an affiliation in order to conduct Training & Development programmes / Workshops / Conferences / Seminars, Faculty Development Programme (Research & Development, Entrepreneurship Development and Management Development), Student Development Programmes (Entrepreneurship Development

(Awareness Camps, etc.), Skill Development / Employability Skill, Career Development, Orientation Programmes, Certification Programmes / Courses, Education Development Programmes, etc. in association with National Foundation for Entrepreneurship Development (NFED), Coimbatore, Tamil Nadu.

- (b) Represent in the Board of Studies of Academic Departments under SME-SMC.
- (c) Act in a good spirit of co-operation in their dealings with each other; and
- (d) Give due consideration to the needs of the other at all times to promote a spirit of co-operation and mutual support between the Parties.

The following items are intended by both the parties and executed with mutual consent and acceptance by the aforementioned parties:

1. Conduct of Faculty Development Programmes for the faculties under SME-SMC between December 2019 – December 2022.
2. Conduct of Student Orientation Programmes in various departments under SME-SMC between December 2019 – December 2022.
3. Represent Board of Studies under SME-SMC for fostering Design & Development of Curriculum for the effective learning of students.
4. Implement the same in accordance with guidelines and provisions at the college premises in the concerned department.
5. SME-SMC, Thoothukudi shall provide the amenities (Class / Conference Rooms / Seminar Halls with Good Ambiance, LCD Facility, Audio-Visual Facility & Computer Labs (if required)) for implementation of all the programmes planned within Dec 2019 – Dec 2022.

PUBLICITY & COURSE MATERIAL

NFED agrees to allow the usage of Logo to the associating partner institution / organization (SME-SMC, Thoothukudi) or vice-versa to be used on its promotional material (offline (print materials) and online (website & social media networking portals)) with regard to the certification programme / courses / activities in association with NFED, Coimbatore and agree to comply with the following conditions:

- i. NFED's Chairman shall be a co-signee in all the joint certification programmes, whichever programmes instituted under the purview of this MoU executed between SME-SMC.
- ii. NFED shall facilitate the teaching-learning effectiveness, evaluation and assessment purposes of faculties and students in the aforementioned programmes devised under SME-SMC, Thoothukudi.
- iii. SME-SMC can list NFED, Coimbatore on its website for promotional content / flyer / publicity invitation / materials / handouts for the benefit of the concerned faculties and students in the departments under its purview and wider reach as its Associate Partner.

- iv. NFED shall provide learning materials (wherever required in soft copies) to the Dean, SME-SMC and / or Heads of concerned departments for official records and circulation to the beneficiaries (Faculties and / or Students (whichever applicable)).
- v. NFED shall submit the programme outline and / or syllabus / modules to the Dean, SME-SMC and / or Heads of concerned departments for official records and circulation to the beneficiaries (Faculties and / or Students (whichever applicable)).
- vi. NFED shall nominate resource persons (if necessary) in accordance with the nature of the programme and its requirements for smooth conduct of the programmes.
- vii. NFED shall prepare the feedback and / or assessment procedures (if required) and administer the same in the programmes / courses for continuous learning and improvement of the same.
- viii. The period of courses / training programmes / any programmes under the purview of this MoU shall be discussed with the Dean, SME-SMC and / or Heads of concerned departments for teaching-learning effectiveness and planned accordingly for implementation of the same under SME-SMC.

FINANCIAL ARRANGEMENT & DISBURSEMENTS

- a) The aforementioned Programmes / Courses are charged on case-to-case basis in accordance with number of participants and / or by fixing up a flat honorarium by NFED Chairman and approved by Dean, SME-SMC and paid by St. Mary's College (Autonomous), Thoothukudi. Also, SME-SMC shall generate income through its programmes in calling for external participation with charges / fees as applicable and mandated by Dean, SME-SMC, Thoothukudi.
- b) NFED shall meet up its expenses for payment of honorarium and / or session charges (including travel) to the concerned Resource Person / Session Speaker (if required) for conducting / handling / moderating the same at the concerned departments.
- c) NFED shall ensure the smooth conduct of all the courses / programmes whichever scheduled under this MoU.
- d) NFED Chairman shall suggest the break-up of the amount to be paid in the Current Account maintained with Indian Overseas Bank (Ac/No. 170902000001043), Rathinapuri Branch, Sanganoor Road, Coimbatore vide NEFT / RTGS / Cheque / Cash Deposit and the remaining by cash to Chairman, NFED as per his expression for all the programmes / courses in association with NFED, Coimbatore, Tamil Nadu.

- (b) Maintain periodic review and discussions thereon and submit the same to the Chairman & Presidium Chair / His / Her Nominee / Authorized Personnel appointed / nominated by the Presidium / Board of Management / Executive Board / Board of Directors for ratification and approval / concurrence for activities / programmes / contracts / collaboration / association / projects / hiring / staff / consultant / ad-hoc appointments / inclusion & removal) in accordance with MoU and its continuance / renewal thereof.

PURPOSE OF THIS MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

- a. The provisions of this MoU are intended to describe the manner and extent to which the Parties will work together.
- b. The MoU records the current level of Association between the Parties and is a record of their intentions in respect of the issues described in this MoU.
- c. The Parties agree that the MoU is not contractually binding and that this MoU does not impose any legal liability or obligation on each Party or their respective employees, contractors, agents and advisers.

DURATION & TERMINATION OF THIS MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

- a) This MoU shall remain in effect for an initial period of **three year** from the date of signing and may be renewed at the time of expiration to a subsequent term on mutual consent unless any or both the parties agree to discontinue thereof.
- b) This MoU may be terminated at any time by either party with one month notice on mutual / amicable terms.

c) In case of discontinuance of this MoU the interest of the training programmes / events / programmes planned (interim / final stages / phases) shall be protected by both parties for execution and / completion of the same thereof without any hindrance.

d) Notwithstanding any termination or expiration of this MoU, the rights and obligations under clauses 'Confidentiality', 'Intellectual Property Rights', 'Ethicality' and 'Representations & Warranties' shall survive and continue and shall bind the parties and their legal representative(s), successor(s), arbitrator(s) and assignee(s).

BEAUTY 2 U PARLOUR

This Memorandum of Understanding is entered into on this 2nd day of February between Department of Economics, St.Mary's College (Autonomous), an educational Institution (hereinafter called " COLLEGE ") and Beauty 2 U Parlour (hereinafter called "CENTRE") with its registered office at Trichirappalli.

SCOPE

The parties has decided to agree to establish industry-academic collaboration in areas of mutual interest and in accordance with terms and conditions set forth in this Memorandum of Understanding.

The College and the Centre agree on the following activities:

- The Centre will provide support for designing the course curriculum at the College which would be relevant for Beauty Therapy. To achieve this senior official from the Centre will work in close collaboration with the faculty members of the College.
- Once the curriculum is designed and courses relevant to Beauty Therapy are offered at the College senior officials of the Centre will share their knowledge and experience by way of taking sessions, participating in seminars and other academic activities of the College.
- The Centre will offer internship to interested students of the College at its offices or project locations so that the students get hands on experience of live projects. The number of students, who can be considered for internship, would be mutually decided between the Centre and the College every year.
- The College will arrange periodic field visits for the faculty and the students in the Centre's project sites to enable them to get practical exposure and learning from interaction with members or project teams of the Centre.
- Depending on requirement, the Centre may offer specific projects with identified deliverables to be executed by the College.

- After the college starts offering courses relevant to Beauty Therapy in which the Centre operates and based its requirements, the Centre may participate in campus placements.
- Each party will appoint one nodal officer to periodically review and identify ways to strengthen cooperation between them.

OBJECTIVES

By working together for the benefits of both it is aimed that the following objectives can be fulfilled, thus making the education at both ends more purposeful and meaningful.

- Work together in such a way that this partnership will be a role model to other Institutions and Companies to follow.
- Help mutually to grow in content updating, management and skill training to enable the students and faculty to excel in their respective fields.
- Train necessary human resources so that the updating programmes can be made cost effective.
- Enable the students to appear for campus selection.

TERMS OF REFERENCE

The Department of Economics, St.Mary's College (Autonomous), Thoothukudi and the Pearl Shipping Centre, Thoothukudi will arrange and offer Training programmes in the area identified by both the College and the Centre to the faculty and students of the college and members of the Centre and the other public and provide other assistance will enter into a **MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING** signed by Dr. Sr. Alphonse Rosaline Mary, Principal, St.Mary's College (Autonomous) and Ms. Edwina Xavier, Beautician, Beauty 2 U Parlour, Tiruchirapalli with written understanding with respect to identification of areas in which training to be given, organising, controlling and monitoring of various training programmes and general policies developed as and when necessary for other activities, budgeting, accounting and sharing of proceeds in case of joint venture programme and sustainability of the venture on a long term basis.

COLLEGE – CENTRE ADVISORY BOARD

For effective implementation of the programmes an Advisory Board was constituted. The Dean of Arts, Dean of Science and Head of the Department of Economics of the college will be inducted into the Advisory Board as members. The Principal will be the chairman of this Board. The Beautician of Beauty 2 U Parlour will also be inducted in this Advisory Board. The Advisory Board will lay

down policy guidelines, fixing up of physical and financial targets, suggesting measures for raising funds, effective utilisation of facilities and expertise available in the college and the Centre and sourcing of expertise and facilities from outside in the region. The advisory Board will meet as and when required.

The Dean of Arts is the convener of the Board. She will convene the Board meeting and inform the members as and when required. She will prepare the minutes of the meeting.

PROGRAMME DEVELOPMENT

The members of the Centre will take part in the conferences, seminars and workshops conducted by the College for the exchange of information. The staff and students of the College will also take part in the conferences, seminars and workshops conducted by the Centre.

The Centre and the College will assess the needs and draw plans for offering various joint venture programmes to the outsiders also. The course may be delivered at the college or Centre or outside or in any place decided by the College and the Centre.

TERMS AND TERMINATION

This MOU, unless extended by mutual written agreement of the parties, shall expire 10 years after the effective date specified in the document. This MOU may be amended or terminated earlier by mutual written agreement of the parties at any time. Either party shall have the right to unilaterally terminate this MOU upon 60 days prior written notice to the other party. The terms and conditions of this Memorandum of Understanding may be amended or cancelled or substituted by fresh terms at any time with mutual consent of the parties hereto.

RELATIONSHIP

Nothing in this MOU shall be construed to make party a partner, an agent or legal representative of the other for any purpose.

ASSIGNMENT

It is understood by the Parties herein this MOU is based on the professional competence and expertise of each party and hence neither Party shall transfer or assign this Agreement, or rights or obligations arising hereunder, either wholly or in part, to any third party.

COSTS OF THE MOU

Each Party shall bear the respective costs of carrying out the obligations under this MOU.

SIGNED IN DUPLICATE

This MOU is executed in duplicate with each copy being an official version of the Agreement and having equal legal validity.






The parties have agreed to establish Industry - Academic collaboration in areas of mutual interest and in accordance with terms and conditions set forth in this Memorandum of Understanding.


GML and St. Mary's agree on the following activities.


Advisory Board

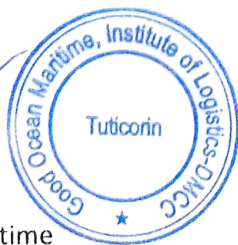

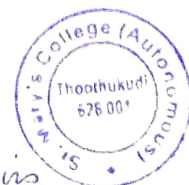
1. It is mutually understood and agreed that the Joint program shall be called as Professional Diploma (Logistics & Shipping)
