### Report for the Centre of Cultural Excellence for 2018 -2024

#### Report 2023 - 2024

The Centre for Cultural Excellence contributed to the cultural activities of the college and facilitated student participation in fine arts, both on and off-campus. The cultural team of the college gives performances for all the events of the institution. Students perform for the inauguration of the Students Council. Classical, Folk, and Western dance performances are made for the National festivals and religious festival celebrations. Traditional folk art was performed for Pongal and College Day celebrations.

As part of celebrating the *Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav*, Nehru Yuva Kendra Sangathan, Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports, Government of India in association with St. Mary's College conducted the District Youth Festival on July 13<sup>th</sup> 2023. 256 students from different age groups belonging to Thoothukudi district participated in all the events.

Students of the college took part in the Inter-Collegiate Cultural Competition – SPRINGS 2K23 held at Fatima College on 16<sup>th</sup> September 2023. The team won the Overall Championship for the second consecutive year.

Jaycee Pearl City Thoothukudi, conducted an intercollegiate competition, Book Quest 2023 on September 22<sup>nd</sup> 2023 to kindle the interest of book reading among college students. 13 different sets of competitions were conducted on Tamil and English books. The college team won the Overall Runners Trophy of The Book Quest 2023.

## **Grand Finale Culturals**

### **Dance- Drama- Orchestra**

The Grand Finale of the Platinum Jubilee celebrations featured an extravagant cultural feast, marking the anniversary of the college's remarkable 75 years of jubilant journey. It began with a short film on glimpses of the past, years 1945 to 1950, followed by the Platinum Jubilee Anthem. The cultural team gave a spellbinding one-hour performance, interspersed with dramatic narratives of indelible memories of the college and a spectacular feat of dances.
