Principal's Report - Academic Activities for the period April 2018 to October 2018

Dear members of the Academic Council,

Warm greetings to you all.

At the threshold of completion of seven decades of fruitful service in providing higher education to the marginalized and underprivileged sections of the society, I acknowledge with gratitude the dedicated service of the Marian family in uplifting and empowering the womenfolk in and around the coastal areas of Thoothukudi. I am proud to state that the college has excelled over the years and wish to place on record the significant academic activities of the college for the period June 2018 to October 2018.

Orientation Programme was conducted at the beginning of the academic year to refresh and renew the self confidence and vigor among the students, faculty and non-teaching staff in accomplishing the institutional goals.

I am immensely happy to inform the members of this august body that our college has been shortlisted under Star College Scheme to present the proposal at New Delhi. We are also selected to participate in the Unnat Bharat Abhiyan.

Dr. Flora got a project on "Biodegradation of Microplastics by Bacteria isolated from Thoothukudi" from Bio-Tech Bags India Pvt.Ltd., Chennai.

Four of our faculty members from different disciplines viz., Dr. N. Shanmuga Vadivoo @ Shanthi, Department of Tamil, Dr. J. Antony Rajam and Dr. Zozymus Divya Lobo, Department of Chemistry (SSC), and Dr. B. Shanmuga Jothi, Department of English (SSC) have been conferred doctoral honours during this period.

Three candidates have emerged as doctors from the Research Centres of Mathematics and History. In the month of July, Doctoral Committee meetings were conducted in the Research Centres of English Literature, Mathematics, Botany and Zoology. 57 research papers have been published by the faculty during this period.

The Department of Tamil organized a book- releasing ceremony on 13th July 2018. Dr. Sr. A. Maria Shanthi's book entitled 'Ezhunthu Ozhi Veesu', Dr. Sr. M. S. Ezhilarasi's book entitled 'Siva Gnanapotha Uraikalil Verupaadukalum Karanangalum', Dr.A.M.Sonal's book 'Ilakkiyathil Vaazhviyal Nerikal' and Miss. L.Catherine Lukmisha's book bearing the title 'Saathanaiyalarkal Thevai' were released.

Ultrasonic Society of India's II students' chapter was inaugurated on 18th July 2018. Dr.P.Palanisamy, Retired scientist, IGCAR, Kalpakkam presided and delivered a talk on *Ultrasonics*.

I am also glad to inform you that an International Conference was organized by the Department of Microbiology on *Applied Science*. A National Seminar was organized by the Department of Library and Research Forum on the topic *Fostering Transparency:Routing out Plagiarism A to Z*. Two Workshops were organized by the departments of Commerce and Computer Science in which hands-on training were provided on GST and Android Studio. The Research Forum also organized a workshop on *Hands on Training on Data Analytics Using SPSS* on 24th & 25th August 2018.

The Department of Botany organized hands-on training in mushroom cultivation for their students as part of practical learning. It can also promote entrepreneurial initiative among the students.

On 20th & 21st August 2018, a workshop on 'Born to Lead' was conducted by the Vice Principals and Students Council Advisors. All the UG & PG class representatives participated in it. Mr. Bernard Chandra, Retired Professor, St. Xavier's College (Autonomous), Palayamkottai, Mrs. Anne Rose, Project Officer, Tamil Nadu Social Service Society, Trichy and Dr. Sr. Jessie Fernando, Associate Professor of Physics, animated the session.

Interschool Quiz Competition 'Physcom 2018' was conducted by the Department of Physics on 24th August 2018. Ten Schools participated and Karapettai Nadar Boys School won the first prize.

Energy Audit was conducted by Energy Audit team of Thiagaraja College of Engineering in our college on 20th & 21st of August 2018 to measure the minimum possible annual energy saving potential.

World Photography Day was celebrated by the Department of Visual Communication on 29th August 2018 with an exhibition of photography.

On 19th September 2018, thirteen PG students and two staff members of the Department of History visited the Tamil Nadu Archives and Connemara Library, Chennai, as part of their curricular activity.

Intra departmental competition 'Emporia Zest' was conducted by the Department of Commerce (SSC) on 26th September 2018.

Intercollegiate competitions 'Zealith' and 'Histofest' were conducted by the Departments of English Literature and History on 27th September and on 1st October 2018 respectively. Nine colleges participated in 'Zealith' and St. Xavier's College (Autonomous), Palayamkottai won the overall trophy. Seven colleges participated in 'Histofest' and overall rolling shield was bagged by Women's Christian College, Nagercoil.

Principal, Dr.Sr.A.S.J.Lucia Rose and Dr. T. Linda Fernando, Dean, School of Physical and Computing Sciences attended the National Conference on the theme: 'Changing Landscape of Higher Education in India and Impending Challenges' on September 22nd and 23rd at Christ University, Bangalore.

Skill Development Programme was conducted on 'Smart Phone Servicing' in association with New Technology, Coimbatore, on 28th and 29th September 2018. 80 students got benefitted by this programme.

Industrial visits were organized by the Departments of Commerce, Microbiology, Zoology and MHRM. Field Trips for plant collection were organized by the Department of Botany.

Reconvene '18 the Intra -Departmental Management Meet was organised by the alumnae of the Department of BBA on 5th October 2018. They motivated the students by conducting competitions and recognising their talent.

On 6th of October, an awareness was created among the students about the necessity of mental health which can only contribute to proper physical health. Students of Psychology made and displayed face paintings of the various positive and negative emotions. This created an

awareness that mental health depended completely on the individual and his/her choice of emotions.

Dr. D. Amutha, Associate Professor of Economics will receive the IARDO Academic Excellence Award 2018 in the International Conference on Multi Disciplinary Research and Latest Innovation at the International Centre, Goa and Gurukul Institute of Engineering and Technology. Kota on 28.10.2018.

The area near the Fatima Hall has been utilized to construct Star Hall for conducting meetings. It can accommodate 400 students. It is noteworthy that the staff members have voluntarily contributed to the construction of the edifice. The construction began in the month of November 2017 and got completed in the month of May. It was inaugurated in May 2018.

The name of our college remains engraved in the Sports History of Manonmaniam Sundaranar University since our players and athletes always bring glory to their institution by winning the overall trophy for the past 25 years. This year is no exception and I am proud to declare that we have retained the trophy this year also.

Report from Deans' Office

Academic Calendar:

The academic calendar for the year 2018-2019 was prepared, incorporating changes in the evaluation pattern and it was distributed to the faculty and students.

Non Major Elective :

The choice of Non Major Elective was offered on the basis of 'First come First served' in the academic year 2017-2018. In this regard, Joint Director of Collegiate Education Dr. Sarala Thembavani insisted that the 'modus operandi' in the choice of Non Major Elective must be made more student-friendly. As per her recommendation, an awareness of the different subjects offered for Non Major Elective highlighting the significance of each was provided in the Mentor – Mentee meet, through a power point presentation prepared by the Deans. The students were then asked to list their first 3 choices. Based on their preferences, courses were allotted to the students, and 65% of the students got their first option, 20% of the students got their second option, 10% of the students accepted their third option, while the remaining 5% of the students were counselled to take up the vacant seats in the departments. The final list of the students with their respective Non Major Elective choice was prepared and submitted to the Controller's office.

Ability Enhancement Course:

The I Semester's Ability Enhancement Course is Value Education. A book, comprising content from different books on Value Education, was compiled in the Deans' Office. The compiled matter was printed as study material and supplied to the students.

Star College

The Star College Scheme has been initiated by DBT with an idea to enhance conceptual clarity, development of scientific thinking and creativity among students. It also envisages interactive participation among different scientific disciplines and departments with a holistic approach towards science rather than compartmentalized thinking.

The well-drafted proposal for undergraduate training submitted by our college under Star College Scheme has been shortlisted for presentation. The Principal Investigator, the Vice Principal Dr. Sr. A. Arockia Jenecius Alphonse will present the proposal on 26th November, 2018 at New Delhi.

Ph. D. Course Work

Acquisition of knowledge, critical observation, analytical skills, problem-solving approach are the key components required for a researcher. Now U.G.C. has recommended that the research scholars broaden their knowledge base through Course Work, in order to promote quality education both at teaching and research levels.

In our six centres of Research, approximately 54 research scholars are pursuing research under our faculty members. Motivated by our sense of obligation, we have designed the Course Work on the basis of advanced study of their particular discipline or emerging new area of research. We place before the members of the Academic Council, the proposed Course Work and policy for Research for ratification.

Ph. D. Course Work guidelines

As per revised UGC guidelines (31.05.2018) and in accordance with Manonmaniam Sundaranar University regulations for award of Ph. D. Degree, a research scholar, after admission to Ph.D. programme shall be required to undertake course work for a minimum period of one semester. The prescribed course work should be completed within two years from the date of provisional registration for both full-time and part-time scholars.

Full-time Scholars :

All full time scholars should sign on all working days in the attendance register maintained by the respective Research Centre.

Part-time Scholars :

The candidate shall work and interact with the supervisor periodically till the submission of the thesis.

Course Work :

1. Candidates with P.G. Degree should earn 16 credits viz., 4 Course Work of 4 credits each **(OR)** 3 Course Work of 4 credits each and 1 mini project of 4 credits.
2. Candidate with M.Phil. should earn 8 credits viz. 2 Course Work of 4 credit each **(OR)** 1 Course Work of 4 credits and 1 mini project of 4 credits.
The Course Work selected by the candidates should be recommended by the Doctoral Committee. The courses shall be selected by the candidate from the courses offered by the respective research department. Hence **each Research Centre shall offer at least four Course Work.**
3. If the research guide wishes to design a new course work specific to the area of research, it could be formulated by her, approved by the Board of Studies and ratified in the Academic Council. A scholar can undertake one such Special Elective.

4. The details of the mini project undertaken by Scholars should have the following components :

Introduction

Literature Survey

Objective and Methodology

Results, Discussion and Bibliography

- ❖ Format of the mini project shall be the same as that of a thesis.
- ❖ Total number of pages shall be between 40 and 80 pages.
- ❖ Mini Project shall be evaluated by the Doctoral Committee and marks should be submitted to the COE.

- ❖ Those candidates who would like to do all the four / two Course Work at a time in one semester shall be allowed to complete them in the same semester itself.

5. The question pattern and evaluation procedure of the Course Work are as follows :

- ❖ The research scholars should submit the completely filled up application form to the Controller's Office.
- ❖ An enrollment number will be allotted to enable easy data management.
- ❖ Ratio of internal and external exam is 25:75.
- ❖ Uniform evaluation pattern and question pattern for both internal and external will be followed.

Evaluation Pattern :

Internal Exam (Average of best two tests) = 25 Marks

External Exam = 75 Marks

Question paper pattern for Internal Exam :

Time : 1 hour Total Marks : 25

Section A : 3 x 5 =	15	(Internal choice) (200 words each)
Section B : 1 x 10 =	10	(Internal choice) (400 words each)
Total	25	

Question paper pattern for External Exam

Time : 3 hours Total Marks : 75

5 x 15 =	75	(Internal choice) (Not less than 500 words each)
Total	75	

- ❖ Minimum pass mark is 50%
- ❖ External Examiner will set the question for external examination.
- ❖ External exam will be conducted as a special exam.
- ❖ Research guide evaluates the internal as well as external answer paper. If a candidate fails in the exam, a chance to reappear will be given and further steps will be decided by the Doctoral Committee members.
- ❖ Doctoral Committee members will evaluate the mini project.
- ❖ There should be an interval of at least six months between Doctoral Committee meeting and external examination. External Examination will be conducted after fulfilling all requirements as specified by the Research Guide.
- ❖ Mode of fee payment should be through South Indian Bank Chalan or Demand Draft drawn in favour of Controller of Examinations.
- ❖ Hall ticket will be generated and issued to the scholar for external exam.
- ❖ Internal, external and Mini Project marks will be forwarded to the Controller of Manonmaniam Sundaranar University in the prescribed format.

NAAC Visit

IQAC Activities

The institution is preparing to face the 4th cycle of accreditation. We are one of the few colleges to appear for NAAC reaccreditation under new format which demands more precision and accuracy. Preparation for NAAC visit started with Internal and External Academic Audit conducted in April 2017.

The IQAC is involved in the final NAAC preparatory work. All activities have been oriented towards collecting and collating documents with the support of all the faculty members of the college. Presentation of the work done was made to the Administrators of the institution on 7th September 2018. They expressed their satisfaction and approval in this First Review Meeting.

A meeting for staff-in-charge-of Student Satisfaction Survey (SSS) was held on 17th September 2018. Sr. Flora Mary, Secretary addressed on the prior need to prepare and motivate students to be ready for NAAC student satisfaction survey.

The second and third review meetings were chaired by Dr. Lourdusamy, IQAC Coordinator, St. Xavier's College (Autonomous) Palayamkottai, and Dr. V.S. Joseph Albert, Deputy Principal, St. Xavier's College (Autonomous) Palayamkottai. Both of them appreciated and offered suggestions for further strengthening of data with the help of the departments.

A Fourth Review Meeting is held on 27th October. Dr. James, Scott Christian College, is to assess the final work and offer his opinion. The IQAC intends to make a final presentation on 31st October for all the staff for final purview and endorsing.

Research Activities

Principal's Report - Academic Activities for the period November 2018 to April 2019

Dear members of the Academic Council,

Warm greetings to you all.

The even semester dawned for St. Mary's College with renewed vigour and enthusiasm. Dr. Sr. A. Arockia Jenecius Alphonse presented the proposal for Star College Scheme on 26th November 2018 in the Department of Biotechnology, Ministry of Science and Technology, New Delhi.

To the credit of the Department of all Sciences, the college has been bestowed the privilege for implementation of the scheme in January 2019. In the month of March, non-recurring amount of Rs.40 lakhs and a recurring amount of Rs.14 lakhs per year have been granted to the college in view of ameliorating the quality of education imparted in the Science Departments of the college.

Dr. Sheeba from the Department of Physics, Dr. Stella Arputha Mary from the Department of Mathematics, Dr. Sr. C. Report from Deans' Office

The year 2018-19 is the year of revision of Syllabi for Post Graduate Programmes. Accordingly the Curriculum Development Committee met on 8th January 2019 to take some important decisions before the Board of Studies meet. As per the suggestions made in the Curriculum Development Committee and the resolutions passed in the Board of Studies meet, the following changes were implemented in the PG syllabi.

- The Common Core and Interdisciplinary Elective Courses have been withdrawn from the curriculum in order to provide in-depth knowledge in their respective disciplines
 - The Common Core course is replaced with a Core course relevant to their own discipline.
 - In order to initiate the students to digital learning, one MOOC course has been made mandatory in the first year of the PG programme. In the second year, students can either opt for Self Study Course or MOOC.
 - To acquire more skills in problem solving and critical thinking, additional practicals have been included in the syllabi under school of Biological Sciences.
 - Field work has been introduced in the curriculum of Physics, Botany and Zoology to develop visual literacy and experience hands-on learning.
 - In order to implement effectively the Star College Scheme in the UG Programme, new courses have been introduced in NME in the following disciplines:
 - Botany - Plant Resource Utilization and Food Technology
 - Zoology - Basic Biotechnology and Applied Biotechnology
- It has been resolved that Physics and Chemistry students should opt for only NME courses offered by School of Biological Sciences and students of Zoology and Botany can opt for any NME Course offered by other departments.
 - More thrust has been given on skill development through additional practicals.

IQAC Report

- The IQAC started the online submission of the Self Study Report on 7th December 2018 and completed the submission on 20th January 2019. It was followed by Student Satisfaction Survey. On 29th and 30th January 2019, Dr. S. Sivasubramanian, former Vice-Chancellor of Bharathiar and Noorul Islam Universities addressed the students, teaching and non-teaching faculty. On 29th he gave an input for students on 'Sustaining Quality Culture' and 'Contribution for Excellence' in different sessions. Students found the talk beneficial. In the afternoon, there was a brief presentation and discussion on the Self Study Report that was submitted. On 30th Dr. S. Sivasubramanian addressed the faculty on 'NAAC Preparedness- A Perennial Process'. He also gave nuances in framing the course outcomes and requirements to sustain quality. They expressed their satisfaction at the performance of the institution and placed recommendations in the exit meeting.
